Since 2013, The Slums Derby still remains the grandest soccer fiesta for slum kids in Kampala. From Kisenyi, to Mulago, to Busega, to Kamwokya and now Kibuli, we are here. Saturday 20th and Sunday 21st May 2017 at Kakungulu Memorial School, Kibuli.

We will organise a weekend of football, fun, food and drinking water for over 700 boys and girls in over 50 teams. We will also use the festival to teach the kids about the values of clean Water, Sanitation and Hygiene (WASH) using exciting football 4 WASH drills.

With three weeks to go, we still have some way to go in terms of funding, and are requesting everyone to support in every way you can. We offer shelter, education and school support.
