5th Edition of Christmas Camp is set...

We are ready for Uganda's biggest youth soccer fiesta.

Our volunteers are ready, and so are the teams.

We will start the Christmas Camp with screening of the players on the 28th December 2016. The games will kick-off on the morning of 29th December 2016 and the opening ceremony.

On the 31st December 2016, we will do a community clean up around Kayunga Town before the games can start. We will end the day, and the year with a camp fire.

On the 1st of January 2017, we will have a charity match between the Watoto Wasoka Select team against a select team from Kayunga. We will also have the girls arriving in camp then.

The following day, the girls' tournament will kick off and climax with the finals on the 3rd January 2017.

We will also have the much anticipated, fun-filled match between coaches and our volunteers on the 2nd January 2017.

We will welcome school games teachers, professional coaches and lots of spectators from Kayunga town.

We will also organise workshops ranging on a range of topics including WASH (Water, Sanitation and Hygiene), character building and sports for development.

Watoto Wasoka was founded in 2009.

Watoto Wasoka – football made in slums, is a local NGO based in the heart of Kampala's biggest slums. We are a non-profit, community – led youth development organization which uses soccer as a vehicle for positive change in the life of slum children in Uganda. The organization aims to promote street and slum kids through their love for football, and tries to provide them with an alternative to street life for a better future perspective. We offer shelter, education and school support.

Upon realization of our first model centre, we intend to include health services & job training for those, who do not obtain scholarships.
