Save the dates, **21/22 May 2106**.






### Girls' football

We are a non-profit, community – led youth development organization which uses soccer as a vehicle for positive change in the life of slum children in Uganda. The organization aims to promote soccertalented street and slum kids and tries to provide them with an alternative to street life for a better future perspective. We offer shelter, education and school support.
